SangeethaSaagara A. Kanyakumari and Team Presentation of a Tristhayi Concert

Tristhayi Sangamam presents a rare and path-breaking musical experience, led by the distinguished violin maestro Sangeeta Saagara Vid. A. Kanyakumari. This unique concept reimagines the violin not as a single melodic voice, but as a complete orchestral medium—where the mandra (lower), madhya (middle), and tara (upper) sthayis resonate in unison, creating a rich and symphonic soundscape.

The presentation exemplifies exceptional technical and artistic mastery. The depth required for the lower octave, the precision demanded by the upper octave, and the seamless integration with the middle register together highlight a level of musicianship of the highest order. Achieving such multi-layered expression on a single instrument is both technically complex and aesthetically profound.

This innovative exploration is further enriched by the participation of accomplished disciples Vid. L. Ramakrishnan and Vid. Kamalakaran Vinjamuri, continuing this unique musical vision. Complementing the performance with rhythmic brilliance are Vid. Sri Patri Satish Kumar on the mridangam and Vid. Sri Sunil Kumar on the kanjeera.

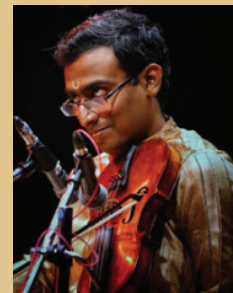
While such layered musical expression is often realized through ensembles, its execution entirely on the violin makes Tristhayi Sangamam a truly distinctive offering—an inspiring confluence of tradition, innovation, and musical imagination.



SANGEETHASAAGARA VIDUSHI A. KANYAKUMARI

Vidushi A. Kanyakumari is one of the foremost exponents of carnatic violin, widely revered for her remarkable versatility as a soloist, accompanist, composer, and guru. She grew up in a musically rich environment that nurtured her early interest in the violin from a young age. After moving to Chennai in 1969, she underwent rigorous training under eminent gurus such as Sri Ivaturi Vijeswara Rao, Sri M. Chandrasekaran, and Dr M L Vasanta kumari,

she has accompanied legends including, Dr. M. L. Vasantakumari, D.K. Pattammal, Dr. M Balamuralikrishna and many prominent artists. Her first U.S. tour was with CMANA alongside the legendary Smt. M. L. Vasanthakumari, and with her participation in the 2026 festival, she completes a remarkable 50-year association with CMANA while continuing to be a leading performer. With a career spanning over five decades, she has developed a distinctive musical voice characterized by a seamless blend of classicism and innovation. Her playing is widely celebrated for its gayaki approach, bringing vocal-like expressiveness to the violin, as well as for her excellence as a composer. Since her early years, she has performed extensively across India and internationally. Beyond the concert stage, her contributions as a teacher have been equally significant, mentoring numerous disciples and imparting her profound musical knowledge across generations.. A Kanyakumari has been awarded Padma Shri (2015),the Prestigious SangeetaSaagara by CMANA in 2016, Sangeetha Kalanidhi from the Madras Music Academy (2016) and the Kalaimamani award from the Government of Tamil Nadu.



VIDWAN L. RAMAKRISHNAN

Vidwan L. Ramakrishnan is a highly respected Carnatic violinist, widely recognized for his excellence as an accompanist. Born into a musical family, he was introduced to music at a young age, beginning with harmonium and bhajans in Kuwait before continuing his training at the Shanmukhananda Vidyalyaya in Mumbai. He took up the violin in 1993 and went on to complete his formal training, earning the Shanmukha Mani title in 2001. He began his violin training under Smt. Visalam Vageeshwar, and later came under the guidance of his current guru, Sangeethakalanidhi Smt. A. Kanyakumari. Under her mentorship, he developed a deep understanding of musical expression, focusing not only on technical precision but also on the intricacies of accompaniment and tonal quality.

Ramakrishnan gave his first Chennai concert at the age of 17 and has since established himself as a highly sought-after accompanist. He has performed alongside leading Carnatic musicians such as Sri T. V. Sankaranarayanan, Smt. Sudha Ragunathan, Smt. Bombay Jayashri, and Sri T. M. Krishna. In recognition of his accomplishments, he has received several honors, including the Best Accompanying Violinist award from The Music Academy, the Lalgudi Jayaraman Award, and the title of Sri Kanchipuram Asthana Vidwan in 2010.



VIDWAN KAMALAKIRAN VINJAMURI

Vidwan Kamalakiran Vinjamuri is a Carnatic violinist based in Washington, D.C. He began his musical training under his grandfather, Sri Parthasarathy Iyengar, and later continued learning from Smt. Malladi Vijayalakshmi and his father, Sri Subhash Vinjamuri. Since 2006, he has been under the tutelage of Sangeethakalanidhi Smt. A. Kanyakumari. A seasoned

performer, Kamalakiran has presented concerts across the United States, India, and Europe. He has performed at prestigious venues including the Kennedy Center, The Music Academy in Chennai, and the Richmond Folk Festival, along with numerous sabhas in India since 2009. He has accompanied several renowned artists in the Carnatic music world, including Sri M. Balamuralikrishna, Sri T. N. Seshagopalan, and Smt. Sudha Ragunathan. In recognition of his exceptional talent, he has received awards from esteemed institutions such as Sri Mylapore Fine Arts, Sri Parthasarathy Swami Sabha, Sri Krishna Gana Sabha, and the Cleveland Thyagaraja Aradhana. In addition to his musical pursuits, Kamalakiran studied Information Technology with a focus on cybersecurity at George Mason University.



VIDWAN PATRI SATISH KUMAR

Vidwan Patri Satish Kumar is a Carnatic mridangist based in India. He was born into a third-generation musical family in Vizianagaram, Andhra Pradesh, and was introduced to the mridangam at the age of three by his mother, Smt. Padmavathi. He received training under renowned gurus including Sri R. Sree Ramachandramurthy, Sri V.A. Swamy, and

Sri V. Narasimham. With over 47 years of concert experience, Patri is a widely acclaimed international performer who has appeared at major venues such as the Rashtrapati Bhavan, Kennedy Center, Royal Albert Hall, Sydney Opera House, and the Music Academy Chennai. Patri also holds the title of an A-grade artist of All India Radio and Doordarshan, Chennai.

As a percussionist, he is known for his exceptional balance between treble and bass tones, as well as his distinctive and influential playing style. He has made significant contributions to the field of percussion, including the development of new rhythmic concepts, the blending of Carnatic and Hindustani percussion styles, and the founding of the Patri Drum Festival. He has received numerous awards and honors for his contributions to music, including the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award in 2020, the Global Peace Award in 2018, and an honorary doctorate from the University of California, Berkeley in 2019 to name a few.



VIDWAN S. SUNIL KUMAR

Vidwan S. Sunil Kumar is a Carnatic kanjira artist, teacher, and stage performer. His initial training in classical percussion came under the guidance of his father, Sri Triplicane K. Sekar. He later pursued advanced training in kanjira from Sri V. Selvaganesh and konnakol from Sri T. H. Vikku Vinayakram. Sunil has accompanied several leading artists, including Smt. Sudha Ragunathan,

Smt. Bombay Jayashri, Sri Sanjay Subrahmanyam, and Smt. A. Kanyakumari, among others. He has performed at major venues and festivals such as the Music Academy Chennai, Sri Krishna Gana Sabha, and Brahma Gana Sabha, as well as at events organized by the Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetham and SVBC programs. Notably, he has also presented a kanjira solo performance for Ustad Alla Rakha. Sunil has received numerous awards and honors for his contributions to music, including the Thethakudi Harihara Sharma Percussion Award from Sri Krishna Gana Sabha in 2011, the Dr. M.S. Subbulakshmi Fellowship from Mumbai Shanmukhananda in 2015, and the title of Asthana Vidwan from the Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetham in 2013.

VIDWAN SANJAY SUBRAHMANYAN

Sangeeta Kalanidhi Vidwan Sanjay Subrahmanyam is one of the foremost Carnatic vocalists of today. He began his musical journey at the age of seven, first learning the violin under V. Lakshminarayana and vocal music from his aunt, the late Sukanya Swaminathan. He then trained in Carnatic vocal music with Smt. Rukmini Rajagopalan for eight years, until 1988, and subsequently came under the guidance of Sri Calcutta K. S. Krishnamurthi

from 1989 until 1999. It was during this period of intensive training that he gradually developed a distinctive musical style, combining strong traditional foundations with a fresh and modern approach. Sanjay Subrahmanyam is one of the founding members of YACM (Youth Association of Carnatic Music) which was created with the purpose of promoting Carnatic music amongst youth. He has received numerous prestigious honors, including the Sangeetha Kalanidhi from the Madras Music Academy, the Shanmukha Sangeeta Shiromani Award, and the Kanchi Jagadguru Sankaracharya Sri Jayendra Saraswati National Eminence Award in Fine Arts from Sri Shanmukhananda Fine Arts & Sangeetha Sabha.



VIDWAN S. VARADARAJAN

Vidwan Sri S. Varadarajan's musical training began with Kanchi Janardhanam and later deepened under the guidance of T.V. Gopalakrishnan, whose multidisciplinary approach shaped his artistry. Emerging early as a dependable accompanist to leading Carnatic vocalists, he developed a style marked by control, clarity, and intuitive musical dialogue. Over the past two decades, he has balanced solo performances with extensive concert tours abroad, bringing Carnatic violin to international audiences. His work has earned several awards and professional recognitions, reflecting his standing within the field and his continued influence across contemporary Indian classical music performance.

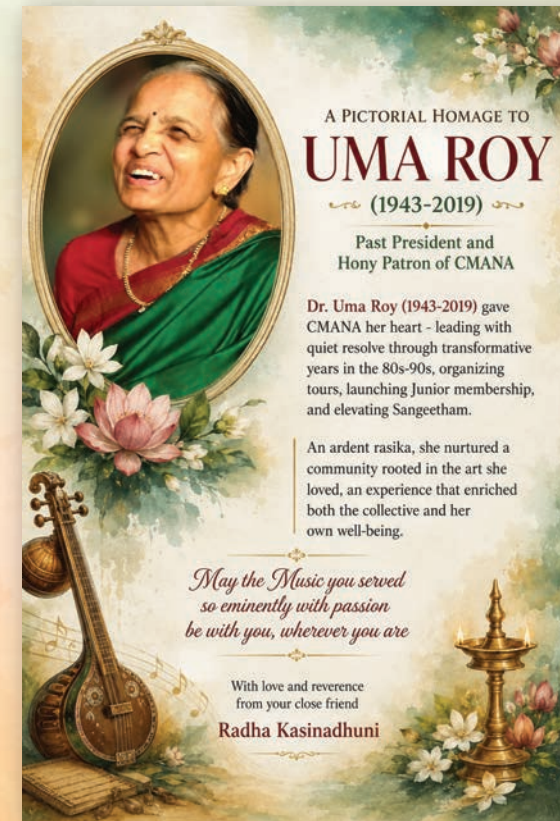
Sri S Varadarajan has performed across the world and is known for his soulful style of violin accompaniment. He has accompanied several leading Carnatic musicians like Sri TN Seshagopalan, Sri TV Gopalakrishnan, Sri Sanjay Subrahmanyam and many more.



VIDWAN NEYVELI VENKATESH

He is a highly distinguished and sought-after mridangam artist, celebrated for his vibrant and sensitive accompaniment. Trained initially under his father A.S. Balaraman, he later refined his artistry under P.P. Venkatesan and M.N. Kandaswamy Pillai. An A-grade All India Radio artist, he has performed at premier venues including the Music Academy, Narada Gana Sabha, and

international festivals such as Darbar (London) and SIFAA (Switzerland). Known for a remarkable 28-hour solo marathon, he has accompanied leading maestros worldwide. With decades of excellence, he continues to elevate concerts through his deep laya insight and musical brilliance.

VIDWAN ISAIKKAVI RAMANAN

Vidwan Isaikkavi Ramanan is an multifaceted thinker, writer, poet, actor, speaker, singer, photographer, and performer who has made a remarkable impact in the world of performing arts. As a public speaker, he is known for his ability to provoke thought, stimulate curiosity, and entertain audiences across a wide range of subjects including literature,

music, cinema, theatre, spirituality, and culture. He is a prolific author who has written dozens of books in both Tamil and English, including collections of poems and essays, and has also contributed through translations between the two languages.

His literary and artistic contributions have earned him numerous accolades, including the prestigious Kalaimamani Award from the Government of Tamil Nadu, though he holds the title "Isaikkavi" especially close to his heart. Deeply inspired by Sri Subramania Bharathi, Ramanan's connection to the iconic poet extends beyond admiration. On stage, he embodies Bharathi in appearance and expression, while in life, his thoughts and writings reflect a similar spirit. As one observer aptly noted, he "breathes" Bharathi. In addition to his literary work, Ramanan has anchored and acted in several television programs focusing on social and spiritual themes.

He is also a playwright, having written the Tamil play Bharathi Yaar?, in which he performs the lead role. His artistic reach extends to English theatre as well, and he has traveled widely across the globe, delivering lectures in both Tamil and English.

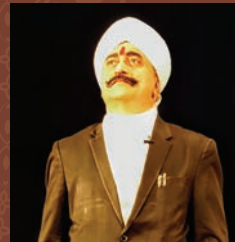
WHO IS BHARATHI ?



Chinnaswami Subramaniyan (1882- 1921), popularly known as Subramania Bharathi or Mahakavi Bharathi (or simply as Bharathi), was an Indian poet, composer, writer, translator, journalist, teacher, Indian independence activist, social reformer and polyglot. Bharathi was well-versed in several languages and had a passion for Tamil, his mother tongue. He was bestowed the title Bharathi for his poetry when he was hardly ten years old; and was a pioneer of modern Tamil poetry and prose. His works covered political, social and

spiritual themes. His impactful works included patriotic songs composed during the early stages of the Indian Independence movement. He fought for the emancipation of women, was against child marriage, supported widow re-marriage, opposed the caste system, and advocated reforms of the society and religion. A true 'national' poet extraordinaire and a world citizen, he epitomized the dictum 'The Pen is Mightier than the Sword'. On the music side, Bharathi was self-taught on Carnatic Music and almost always included a ragam and a talam/mettu for his songs.

SYNOPSIS



This program is a homage to this great patriot and poet, celebrating his contributions via powerful dialogs by Isaikkavi Ramanan, supported by Stage Friends Ramani, Ms. Marichandra Murugan, and Ms. Parvathy Rajagopalan; and via innovating dancing & soulful signing by our own artistes, teachers, and students, all from the NJ/PA/NY region. It is notable that the selected songs and dances cover varied themes around patriotism, spiritual devotion, women

empowerment, social reforms, love, and nature. Many of these songs are easily recognizable by our audiences as they have been popularized by many leading musicians over the years.

HOW THE DRAMA UNFOLDS

Two contemporary conscientious citizens and fans of Bharathi, are wishing to meet Bharathi, who obviously has passed away many years ago. They feel he will offer solutions to many current day problems faced by the society. They both chant two of Bharathi's favorite slogans - "Vande Matharam" and "Om Shakti Om". Bharathi 'magically' appears before them and starts a conversation.

What ensues is a volley of enthusiastic questions from these two fans followed by equally passionate replies by Bharathi himself. In his replies Bharathi elaborated the context and specifies the song he wrote for the context. His narratives are followed by a group singing or group dance of the song.

SCENE 5

Bharathi explains his love for various gods/goddesses – Kali, Kannan (Krishnan), and Murugan (Karthikaya). He recalls how he was asked to sing for a bhajan group in Mowbrays Street in Chennai and how he chose to sing on Muruga bringing tears and raptures to the devotees. Musical comment: Bharathi also mentions that he has sung this song in Kurinji as well as in Harikamboji ragas along with swaras. He stresses the importance of singing with proper devotion and proper diction.

SCENE 6

The conversation pivots to treating women with respect and honor. Bharathi asserts that without freedom for women, there is no freedom for the country. He reminds the audience of the Mahabhartha scene where Droupathi (aka Panchali) is mistreated in the Kauravas court and how Lord Krishna intervenes based on her appeal.

Group singing “hari hari endrAL”. Lyrical comment: This song is from Bharathi’s epic poem-drama – Panchali Sabatham (Panchali’s vow).

SCENE 7

Bharathi is quizzed on his Carnatic Music gurus. Bharathi identifies Saraswathi/Parasakthi and the cuckoo as his gurus. He recites a poem from his famous ‘kuil paattu’ (song of the cuckoo) and goes on to say that – “sounds cause a trigger in the silence of the soul. That is how music is born!”

He further says poems (lyrics) and melody (ragam) and rhythms (talam) always go together and demonstrates it by reciting a poem on Nature.

What follows is a lengthy dialog on the importance of bhava in Carnatic Music. Bharathi uses as example, Thyagaraja’s ‘Chakkani rAja mArgamu’ and the appropriate selection of kharahapriya ragam for this composition. He says the majestic bhava of the ragam fully aligns with the meaning of the lyrics. Bharathi compares Dikshithar’s kritis to the river Kaveri – broad and deep and flowing naturally!

Finally, Bharathi compares rain to poem, especially from a rhythmic similarity. He demonstrates by reciting another song on Nature – this time focusing on rain.

Bharathi’s recital is accompanied by a mridangist and enacted by a dancer, with all of them showcasing multiple adavus, jathis, and nadais.

SCENE 8

Bharathi compares the vagaries of life to the elements of Carnatic Music. He says songs are my boat, my practice (sadamkam) are my oars, familial ups-and-downs are the meandering swaras, rain and thunder are the rhythms. And Parashakthi is the ocean I need to traverse with these tools. He refers to his song ‘eththanai kOdi inbam’ which he says can be sung in thodi raga or danyasi as the singer wishes.

SCENE 14

Bharathi explains how he self-taught Carnatic Music with the help of a harmonium, his friend Subbarama Dikshithar, and by listening to many Hindustani vidwans. He opines that everyone should learn and practice music. Upon being quizzed on ragams and talams for his compositions, Bharathi ascertains that for him ragas provide an outline and swarams are mere indicators with both giving the singing the freedom to innovate and explore. He points to his own foray into Western Music as an example. When asked 'What differences you find between Western music and our music?', he replies "Western music appeals to the mind and heart. Our music touches the soul"

Group singing (with instrument medley) – "karṇaiyoor eṇṇa nagaṇḍAm". Musical comment: This song is Bharathi's translation of the poem 'The Town of Let's Pretend' by the British poet John Scurr. Bharathi's song uses English tunes and aspects of Western music harmony.

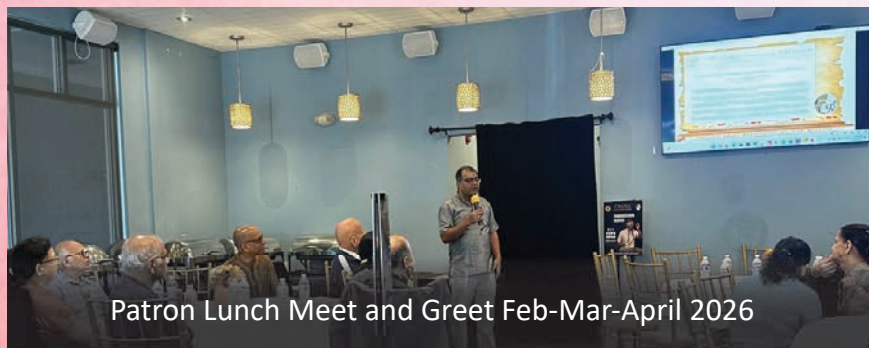

VIDWAN RAMAKRISHNAN MURTHY

Vidwan Ramakrishnan Murthy is a Carnatic vocalist based in Chennai, India. He began his musical training under Smt. Padma Kutty, later going on to study with several distinguished musicians, including Sri Delhi P. Sunder Rajan, Smt. Vairamangalam Lakshmi Narayanan, Sri C.R. Vaidyanathan, Sri Vaikom Jayachandran, and Sri Chengleput Ranganathan. He is currently under the guidance of

renowned violinist Sangeethakalanidhi Sri R.K. Shriramkumar. Ramakrishnan also holds the title of an A-grade artist of All India Radio and Doordarshan, Chennai. In June 2011, Ramakrishnan relocated permanently from California to Chennai to pursue Carnatic music full-time. Since then, he has performed extensively at prestigious sabhas and major music festivals in India and abroad, including the Madras Music Academy. Ramakrishnan has received numerous awards and titles for his contributions to music, including the Ustad Bismillah Khan Yuva Puraskar from the Sangeet Natak Akademi in 2024, the Senior Outstanding Concert Award from the Madras Music Academy in 2017 and 2024, the Yagnaraman Award of Excellence from Shri Krishna Gana Sabha in 2016, and the Kalki Krishnamurthy Memorial Award from the Kalki Krishnamurthy Trust in 2014. In addition to his musical achievements, Ramakrishnan holds a degree in Informatics from the University of California, Irvine.



VIDWAN VITTAL RANGAN

An acclaimed violinist, Vidwan Vittal Rangan is well known for his flair for innovative ideas while simultaneously maintaining the traditional aesthetics. A disciple of the legendary Sangeetha Kalanidhi Kum A Kanyakumari and Sri RR Keshavamurthy. An 'A' graded violinist of the All India Radio, Vittal is a recipient of numerous awards, including the Shanmukhananda

Sangeetha Shironmani Award and the Best Violinist Award from the Music Academy, and he is one of the youngest violinists to have performed at the iconic Royal Albert Hall in London. Vittal has performed and shared the stage with great musicians across four generations all over the world, and is also an exceptional solo violinist.



VIDWAN DELHI SAIRAM

Delhi Sairam is a distinguished mridangam artist and disciple of the legendary maestro Sri Tiruvarur Bhaktavatsalam. Based in Chennai, he is renowned for his refined artistry and deeply sensitive accompaniment, shaped by a strong foundation in rhythm and tradition. A postgraduate rank holder in Rhythmology from the University of Madras, Sairam has built a career spanning

over two decades, performing extensively across India and internationally. He has collaborated with leading musicians such as Smt. Bombay Jayashri, Smt. Sudha Ragunathan, and Smt. Ranjani & Smt. Gayatri, earning recognition for his intuitive and harmonious style. An international ambassador of rhythm, he has toured widely across the US, Canada, Australia, and the Middle East, performing at prestigious global venues.

Beyond the stage, he is a dedicated mentor, having trained over 40 students worldwide and guiding many through their arangetrams. He also serves as visiting faculty at the Kalaikovil Academy of Fine Arts in Toronto. His contributions have been honored with several prestigious awards, including the Kalaimamani, the Bismillah Khan Yuva Puraskar, and the Best Senior Mridangist award from The Music Academy, Chennai.



VIDWAN S. SUNIL KUMAR

Vidwan S. Sunil Kumar is a Carnatic kanjira artist, teacher, and stage performer. His initial training in classical percussion came under the guidance of his father, Sri Triplicane K. Sekar. He later pursued advanced training in kanjira from Sri V. Selvaganesh and konnakol from Sri T. H. Vikku Vinayakram. Sunil has accompanied several leading artists, including Smt. Sudha Ragunathan,

Smt. Bombay Jayashri, Sri Sanjay Subrahmanyam, and Smt. A. Kanyakumari, among others. He has performed at major venues and festivals such as the Music Academy Chennai, Sri Krishna Gana Sabha, and Brahma Gana Sabha, as well as at events organized by the Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetham and SVBC programs. Notably, he has also presented a kanjira solo performance for Ustad Alla Rakha. Sunil has received numerous awards and honors for his contributions to music, including the Thethakudi Harihara Sharma Percussion Award from Sri Krishna Gana Sabha in 2011, the Dr. M.S. Subbulakshmi Fellowship from Mumbai Shanmukhananda in 2015, and the title of Asthana Vidwan from the Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetham in 2013.

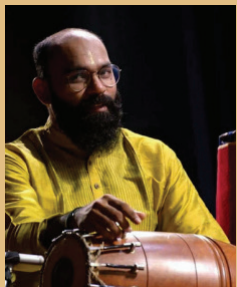


VIDWAN L. RAMAKRISHNAN

Vidwan L. Ramakrishnan is a highly respected Carnatic violinist, widely recognized for his excellence as an accompanist. Born into a musical family, he was introduced to music at a young age, beginning with harmonium and bhajans in Kuwait before continuing his training at the Shanmukhananda Vidyalaya in Mumbai. He took up the violin in 1993 and went on to complete

his formal training, earning the Shanmukha Mani title in 2001. He began his violin training under Smt. Visalam Vageeshwar, and later came under the guidance of his current guru, Sangeethakalanidhi Smt. A. Kanyakumari. Under her mentorship, he developed a deep understanding of musical expression, focusing not only on technical precision but also on the intricacies of accompaniment and tonal quality.

Ramakrishnan gave his first Chennai concert at the age of 17 and has since established himself as a highly sought-after accompanist. He has performed alongside leading Carnatic musicians such as Sri T. V. Sankaranarayanan, Smt. Sudha Ragunathan, Smt. Bombay Jayashri, and Sri T. M. Krishna. In recognition of his accomplishments, he has received several honors, including the Best Accompanying Violinist award from The Music Academy, the Lalgudi Jayaraman Award, and the title of Sri Kanchipuram Asthana Vidwan in 2010



VIDWAN SAI GIRIDHAR

Hailing from a rich musical background, Vidwan Sai Giridhar has trained under eminent gurus and has developed a deep understanding of rhythm, tradition, and stage aesthetics. An 'A' grade artist of All India Radio, Shri Sai Giridhar has performed extensively in many prestigious music festivals in India and abroad. He received the Gold Medal for his performance on the mridangam at 12th National Youth

Festival at Pune in 2007. He has many recordings to his credit. Shri Sai Giridhar Kuchibhotla was also awarded the Ustad Bismillah Khan Yuva Puraskar of Sangeet Natak Academy for the year 2016 for his notable talent in the field of Carnatic instrumental music. Over the years, Shri Sai Giridhar has accompanied many leading Carnatic musicians in prestigious concerts and festivals, both in India and internationally. Sai Giridhar showcased his exceptional rhythmic artistry at the Darbar Festival in both 2015 and 2019, collaborating with renowned artists such as Shri Satyajit Talwalkar, Padma Sri Smt Ranjani and Padma Sri Smt Gayatri, Shri Veena D. Srinivas, Padma Bhushan Smt Sudha Ragunathan, and Shri J.A. Jayanth.



VIDWAN K.V. GOPALAKRISHNAN

Vidwan KV Gopalakrishnan is one of the most celebrated kanjira masters in the world. His playing is celebrated for its breathtaking clarity and tonal beauty that transform the concert experience entirely. Born in a family steeped in music, he began learning kanjira from his father Sri K.V.R.S. Mani. He also learnt mridangam from the legendary Sangita Kalanidhi Vidwan Sri T.K. Murthy, which allowed him to

enhance his kanjira playing as well. Having performed for more than 3 decades he is one of the most sought after percussionists in the carnatic music world. Vidwan KV Gopalakrishnan is an 'A' grade artist of All India Radio. KVG has played alongside some of the legendary percussionists including his guru Dr. T.K. Murthy, Sri Palghat Raghu, Sri Umayalpuram K. Sivaraman, Sri Trichy

Sankaran, Sri Guruvayur Dorai, and many others. Over several decades, Vidwan KV Gopalakrishnan has performed at major sabhas, festivals, and international venues gaining the admiration of audiences and musicians alike. He has performed at several prestigious venues around the world including the Kennedy Center, the Lincoln Center, Madras Music Academy, Cleveland Tyagaraja Festival and many others around the world. He has accompanied some of the greatest doyennes of carnatic music and leading musicians including Dr. M. Balamuralikrishna, Sri TN Seshagopalan, Sri N. Ramani, Sri Lalgudi G. Jayaraman, and so many other legends. This viruttam, comprised of verses by the contemporary Tamil poet Sakthi Jothi, has been specially choreographed as a tribute to the women of CMANA. Her poem, "Vidai," is a meditation on the unsung, quiet labor of sowing seeds, and it is an apt metaphor for the vital role women play in planting, nurturing, and sustaining Indian art, culture, and tradition within the family and for the greater community.

2. Nī Sāti Daivamu

Ragam: Sriranjani

Talam: Rupakam

Composer: Muthuswamy Dikshitar

This daru is one of two compositions in Telugu attributed to Muthuswamy Dikshitar, and he is said to have composed it especially for the dance arangetram of his disciple, Tiruvarur Kamalam. In this composition, the heroine directly expresses her profound love and longing for Valmīkēśa, the manifestation of Lord Shiva as an anthill and the presiding deity of Tiruvarur. She says, "There is no deity equal to you, and so, I have given all my love, hopes, thoughts, and praises to you." Muthuswamy Dikshitar also alludes to an unusual legend from oral history in which Lord Vishnu acquires a powerful bow that endows him with great strength. Intoxicated with power, he pursued Indra and the other gods across the heavens and Earth. When they reached Tiruvarur, the gods prayed to Lord Shiva, and Vishnu's power vanished as soon as he arrived. While Vishnu leaned against his bow, Shiva and the gods transformed into white ants (termites). Shiva's bite snapped the bowstring, and Vishnu fell to the ground and shattered into three pieces.

3. Mahāshakti

Ragam: Sindhubhairavi

Talam: Adi

Lyrics: Subramania Bharathi

Music: K. Hariprasad

This concluding piece was inspired by the philosophy of Karma Yoga as envisioned by Swami Vivekananda. During his seminal 1921 lectures, Vivekananda stated that the "ultimate goal of human nature" is spiritual liberation by discovering the "secret of work." Perhaps the "secret" lies in that the expected outcome of one's work becomes insignificant gradually over time while the work itself becomes absolutely fulfilling and uplifting. That internal transformation of the mind, body, and spirit through work is often equated with the experiences of bhakti. Bharathiar was an ardent follower of Karma Yoga and a staunch believer in

women's rights who devoted his life to India's fight for independence and social reform through his powerful poems, songs, and essays. In his poem, "Mahashakti," he vividly describes a moment of intense spiritual awakening and recognition after he experiences a brief vision of Shakti in the moonlight within the family and for the greater community.

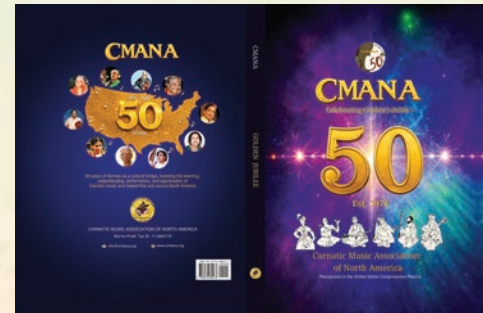

VIDUSHI SUDHA RAGUNATHAN

She stands as one of the most respected and admired artists in Carnatic music today. Today she is praised for her artistry, depth, and unwavering commitment to Carnatic music. She received her initial training in the artform under the guidance of her mother Smt. V. Choodamani. Vid. Sudha Ragnathan continued her musical learning under Sri BV Lakshman further strengthening her skills in the artform. A defining milestone came in 1977, Today, she is celebrated as

one of the foremost torchbearers of the MLV bani, carrying forward its legacy with devotion while shaping a distinctive musical identity of her own. Smt. Sudha Ragnathan's contributions to Carnatic music have been recognized with some of India's highest honors, including Sangita Kalanidhi (2013), Padma Bhushan (2015), and Padma Shri. Vid. Sudha Ragnathan has performed at major venues like the Madras Music Academy since 1990 and her music resonated across premier venues in India and around the world. Her music has taken her to prestigious venues across the United States, Europe, Australia, Southeast Asia, and the Middle East. She performed at the United Nations, Theatre de la Ville in Paris, Alice Tully Hall, and the Lincoln Centre in NY each a testament to her role as a global ambassador of Carnatic music. Beyond her musical accomplishments, Smt. Sudha Ragnathan is deeply committed to social causes as well. In 2017, she started her own school Sudhaaranva Academy for Musical Excellence, an institution devoted to nurturing the next generation of musicians and preserving the rich heritage of Carnatic music. An 'A' graded violinist of the All India Radio, Vittal is a recipient of numerous awards, including the Shanmukhananda Sangeetha Shironmani Award and the Best Violinist Award from the Music Academy, and he is one of the youngest violinists to have performed at the iconic Royal Albert Hall in London. Vittal has performed and shared the stage with great musicians across four generations all over the world, and is also an exceptional solo violinist.



VIDWAN DELHI SAIRAM

Delhi Sairam is a distinguished mridangam artist and disciple of the legendary maestro Sri Tiruvarur Bhaktavatsalam. Based in Chennai, he is renowned for his refined artistry and deeply sensitive accompaniment, shaped by a strong foundation in rhythm and tradition. A postgraduate rank holder in Rhythmology from the University of Madras, Sairam has built a career spanning over two decades, performing extensively across India and internationally. He has collaborated with leading musicians such as Smt. Bombay Jayashri, Smt. Sudha Ragnathan, and Smt. Ranjani & Smt. Gayatri, earning recognition for his intuitive and harmonious style. An international ambassador of rhythm, he has toured widely across the US, Canada, Australia, and the Middle East, performing at prestigious global venues.

Beyond the stage, he is a dedicated mentor, having trained over 40 students worldwide and guiding many through their arangetrams. He also serves as visiting faculty at the Kalaikovil Academy of Fine Arts in Toronto. His contributions have been honored with several prestigious awards, including the Kalaimamani, the Bismillah Khan Yuva Puraskar, and the Best Senior Mridangist award from The Music Academy, Chennai.



VIDWAN G CHANDRASEKHARA SHARMA

Vidwan G. Chandrasekhara Sharma is a distinguished representative of the rich rhythmic and melodic traditions of Carnatic music, known for both his ghatam artistry and vocal excellence. He received his early training under his uncle, the late Sri T. H. Subash Chandran, and comes from a highly respected family of Carnatic musicians. His father, Sri T. H. Gurumurthy, was an accomplished violinist

and disciple of the legendary Sri T. N. Krishnan. He was also the younger brother of renowned ghatam maestros Sri T. H. Subash Chandran and Vikku Vinayakram. Rooted in this rich musical lineage, Chandrasekhara Sharma has developed a style that reflects rigorous training, deep tradition, and artistic individuality. Over the years, he has performed alongside legendary percussionists such as Sri Umayalpuram K. Sivaraman, Sri Tiruvarur Bhaktavatsalam, and Sri T. K. Murthy.

In addition to his percussion expertise, he is also a highly trained Carnatic vocalist and a disciple of Sri R. K. Shriramkumar and Smt. Vijay Siva. His musicianship continues to embody both the depth of tradition and the evolving spirit of Carnatic music.



VIDWAN S. SUNIL KUMAR

Vidwan S. Sunil Kumar is a Carnatic kanjira artist, teacher, and stage performer. His initial training in classical percussion came under the guidance of his father, Sri Triplicane K. Sekar. He later pursued advanced training in kanjira from Sri V. Selvaganesh and konnakol from Sri T. H. Vikku Vinayakram. Sunil has accompanied several leading artists, including Smt. Sudha Ragunathan, Smt. Bombay Jayashri, Sri Sanjay Subrahmanyam, and

Smt. A. Kanyakumari, among others. He has performed at major venues and festivals such as the Music Academy Chennai, Sri Krishna Gana Sabha, and Brahma Gana Sabha, as well as at events organized by the Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetham and SVBC programs. Notably, he has also presented a kanjira solo performance for Ustad Alla Rakha. Sunil has received numerous awards and honors for his contributions to music, including the Thethakudi Harihara Sharma Percussion Award from Sri Krishna Gana Sabha in 2011, the Dr. M.S. Subbulakshmi Fellowship from Mumbai Shanmukhananda in 2015, and the title of Asthana Vidwan from the Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetham in 2013.



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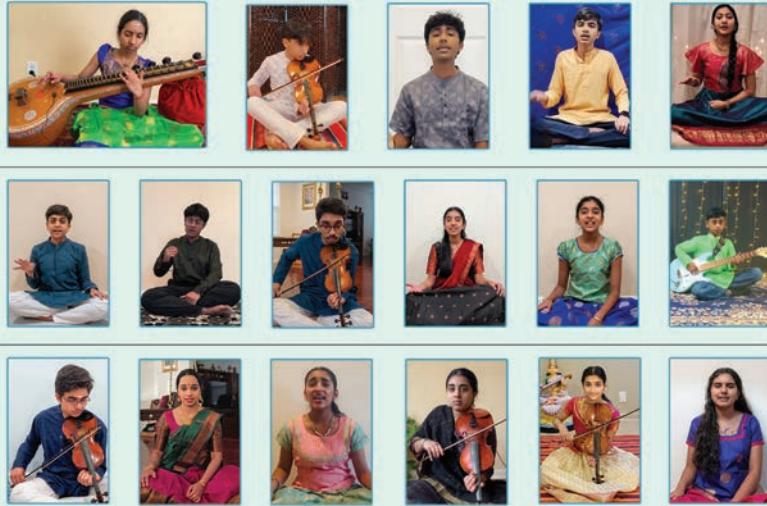
